## Refuse Cans

Have you noticed more garbage, recycle, and yard waste cans as you go about the neighborhood? We have, too. So here is another friendly reminder: All of those cans must be out of sight except on pick-up day (Friday). Put them out no earlier than the night before, and take them back to their hiding places promptly. The Board has begun sending letters of violation to homes that consistently have their cans in view. To avoid a fine, just keep them out of sight.

## Safety FIRST

Please use extreme caution when driving in Hill Creek. We have a very active

neighborhood of walkers, joggers, and playing children. There have been near-accidents caused by inattentive drivers backing out of driveways. Let's avoid a tragedy by always checking in every direction before putting a vehicle in motion.

## Fall/Winter Maintenance

Dipping temperatures and dripping skies don't mean that we should neglect our yards, bushes, and trees. Colder weather can be the right time to prune trees, and trim shrubs. Also be sure to rake up those fallen leaves from your yard, driveway and sidewalk! Roof problems? Many roofers offer lower prices during the "off season".

The best indicator that your home needs work is to step outside, walk out to the street, then turn around and take a long close look. How is the paint? Are there any siding problems? Are your garage doors sagging or buckled?

**MONEY-SAVING TIP:** Get things in shape BEFORE they fall apart. Preventive maintenance is much less expensive than repairs.

## Parking
